

Activity scope

This guideline relates to student participation in basketball as a curriculum activity, including skills development, training and competitions.

Mandatory/special requirements

Mandatory requirements must be met for the activity to be conducted. Special requirements are to be considered in the planning and delivery of this activity.



Building Act Compliance certificates were issued by Project Services, <u>Department of Housing and Public Works</u> (DHPW) during the Basketball structure replacement program. Schools should have a copy of this document or obtain a copy by contacting DHPW.

Regular checks on the condition of the structures could be carried out by DHPW as part of their maintenance condition assessments.

The use of portable structures is discouraged. If using portable hoop structures, a separate risk assessment using the department's <u>risk assessment information sheet</u> is recommended.

Guidelines/codes of practice are established for this activity. Refer to <u>International Federation of Basketball</u> and <u>Basketball</u> Queensland.

Risk level

Medium risk: Teaching of basketball skills, training and competitions.

Minimum supervision requirements

Covered in the Planning Considerations section as outlined in the <u>CARA generic template</u>.

Minimum qualifications for supervisors

- A registered teacher with competence (knowledge and skills) in the teaching of basketball.
 OR
- A registered teacher or other activity leader with <u>Level 1</u> coaching accreditation from Basketball Queensland.
 This course may be undertaken through the <u>Get Active Queensland Accreditation Program</u>.

Minimum requirements for equipment/facilities

- Two warning signs attached to each structure. Attach one on the pole at 1200mm above the ground and the
 other in the top left corner on the front of the backboard. Refer to <u>Basketball Equipment Specification</u> for sign
 specifications.
- A clearly defined playing area (including boundary clearances).
- Adequate lighting and ventilation.
