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RESPONSIBILITIES AS A BUNDABERG DISTRICT COACH/OFFICIAL (GUIDELINES BASED ON WBSS)

- ☐ Obtain your school principal's approval prior to the acceptance of the position as an official;
- ☐ Complete a Risk Assessment (CARA) for your trial;
- ☐ Inform your school and the BDSSS 13-19yrs Secretary of your absence from school during the trials in order to claim for TRS or associated relief;
- ☐ Arrange appropriate training prior to the trials, if required;
- ☐ Arrange, with other coaches and staff members, selection trials and venues;
- ☐ Notify the BDSSS 13-19yrs Secretary of Bundaberg trial information;
- ☐ At the conclusion of the trials hand to all successful players their letter of congratulations and parental/medical information sheets. *Avoid having Sports Coordinators pass this information on to students if possible.*
- ☐ Complete the Team Notification form and pass on details to the BDSSS 13-19yrs Secretary **WITHIN 2 DAYS OF BDSSS 13-19yrs TRIALS**;
- ☐ Complete F10 & F11 forms and send to all relevant schools **WITHIN 2 DAYS OF BDSSS TRIALS**;
- ☐ Ensure selected Bundaberg team members are informed about:
 - Appropriate dress - remember students must travel to Wide Bay trials in their own schools sport uniform.
 - Wide Bay trial/ bus levy – this must be payed to their own school
 - Travel times, bus departure venue and Wide Bay trial venues

This can all be achieved through the distribution of a **player notification letter** given to students at the Bundaberg trials once they are selected in the Bundaberg District Team
- ☐ Contact the school in-charge of the district uniform (currently St Luke's) to arrange the distribution of the uniform to students;
- ☐ Arrange for all necessary equipment including first aid kits to be at trainings and trials;
- ☐ Complete the Wide Bay Selections Nomination Form for the selectors prior to the trials for the students competing for Bundaberg District;
- ☐ Collect all Parent Consent and Team Member Code of Behaviour forms from students prior to travel;
- ☐ Confirm with the BDSSS 13-19yrs Secretary the students that **ACTUALLY** attended Wide Bay trials and their schools – **WITHIN 2 DAYS OF WIDE BAY TRIALS**; and
- ☐ **REMAIN with students** and in position of '*loco parentis*' of team members upon return from Wide Bay Trials until all students are collected.
- ☐ Complete the Wide Bay Representative Selection form and send to the BDSSS 13-19yrs Secretary – **WITHIN 2 DAYS OF WIDE BAY TRIALS**.

Remember as coach you must provide all players with the best opportunity for selection and allow them to demonstrate their abilities at the Wide Bay trials fairly with the policy of equal time for all players being adhered to. The following are maximum team numbers for all sports at Wide Bay and if possible coaches are to fill all positions.

PLEASE NOTE: As these numbers are the MAXIMUM number of students that can be selected in a Wide Bay team, Bundaberg Coaches must ensure that Bundaberg Teams going to Wide Bay Trials also DO NOT exceed these numbers. You are **not** obliged to take the maximum number to Wide Bay Trials, but you cannot exceed the maximum number.

VERY IMPORTANT:

Regional Coaches are reminded of the Regional Policy Statement

“Those students selected to represent the Region at State level must be given a fair and reasonable amount of participation in games conducted at the State Championships.”

BUNDABERG DISTRICT TRIALS

Responsibilities of the coach as a selector:

- ☐ In consultation with the Bundaberg District Trial Convenor arrange a suitable time, venue, equipment and referees required for the Bundaberg District selection trials (preferably the same as the other divisions of a similar sport);
- ☐ Notify the District Secretary of the selection trials details as soon as possible after your appointment as a Bundaberg Coach;
- ☐ Allow for adequate time to give all students a fair trial and have a wet weather plan;
- ☐ Negotiate to have at least ONE other staff member from other schools to be present at the selection trials to assist you in the roles as selectors. Where possible, avoid using parents and club personnel as selectors. **PLEASE NOTE: TRIALS SHOULD NOT PROCEED IF TWO SELECTORS (coach plus one other) ARE NOT PRESENT – TRIALS SHOULD BE RE-SCHEDULED.**
- ☐ Selection criteria shall be based on the WBSS selection policy. Areas considered shall include:
 - the level of skills exhibited by the student,
 - the performance of the student as a member of a team,
 - the attitude and behaviour of the student on and off the field of competition,
 - the age of the student, and
 - the attendance of an affiliated school within the Bundaberg District with the following exception: - *A student/s from another Wide Bay School Sport affiliated district may participate in Bundaberg sports trials for selection in a Bundaberg team for Wide Bay trials, when that affiliated district does not have its own team in that sport participating in Wide Bay trials. This is restricted to sports that compete on a team basis. In this circumstance, the sports coordinator (or proxy) from the school involved is to contact the relevant BDSS coach in advance of the trials to inform him/her of this situation.*
- ☐ Players who are participating for another representative sport at the time of the trials may be considered for selection, provided written application, supported by their Principal, has been submitted to the BDSSS association and/or the district coach (based on WBSS policy).
- ☐ A student who has an approved absence (eg illness, injury, family bereavement) at the time of the trials, may be considered for selection in the district team, provided that appropriate documentation or evidence is submitted to the district coach (based on WBSS policy).
- ☐ Selectors must be seen to provide all students a fair opportunity to demonstrate their ability in the selections trials. Game formats are normally used to identify the student's understanding and ability of the game, followed by possibles/probables scenarios. Some sports will require outside proof of player's ability eg golf handicaps at the record cards;
- ☐ All members selected to represent the Bundaberg team must be informed (including shadows if necessary), by way of written confirmation immediately following the final selection trials. Avoid sending letters and forms to schools to distribute to players. (See example of the player's notification letter).

Remember selectors are to choose the best players and to be fair and equal in their judgements of player's abilities. Players must therefore perform well at the trials before they can be eligible.

STUDENTS UNABLE TO ATTEND BUNDABERG TRIALS

Students unable to attend BDSSS 13-19yrs trials should make the Bundaberg Coach aware of this either directly or through their own school's Sports Coordinator. If the student is to be considered for BDSS team selection, the Bundaberg Coach must be aware that the student is unable to trial **BEFORE** the trials commence. Once trials commence (and particularly after the BDSS team is announced) there will be no further consideration of students for teams.

Students who are unable to attend BDSSS trials should:

- See their own school's sport coordinator to get an 'unable to attend trials' form.
- Complete the form – including reason for non-participation at trials and a player profile section to assist in selector decisions.
- Return the form to the school sport coordinator or the BDSSS coach within the timelines indicated on the form (see guidelines identified on form below):

Where at all possible students should make arrangements to participate in Bundaberg Trials; including rescheduling appointments or work commitments. Students should understand that failure to attend trials may, in some cases, disadvantage them in the selection process. If students are unable to attend trials or are unable to participate due to injury or illness please ensure you:

- Complete this section of the form
- Return this form (including a medical/ permission form) to your school's Sports Coordinator or the Bundaberg Coach.

Forms must be handed to your school's Sport Coordinator early on (or before) the day of Bundaberg trials in order to allow time for the Sports Coordinator to pass on your details to the Selectors **BEFORE** trials. Alternatively, this form can be given directly to the Bundaberg District Coach or delivered to selectors at the Trial venue **prior to the commencement** of Bundaberg trials. In all cases the Bundaberg Coach, Manager or Selectors **MUST** receive information about students who are unable to participate in Bundaberg Trials **prior to the commencement** of those trials if students are to be considered in the selection process.

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PLAYER NOTIFICATION LETTER

EXAMPLE ONLY – MAKE CHANGES WHERE REQUIRED BEFORE GIVING TO STUDENTS

Dear Player

Congratulations on your selection to play for the Bundaberg District 13-19yrs School (DIVISION AND SPORT) team for your age group. With the numbers of students currently playing this sport in the district at the present time this is quite an achievement. You are one step closer to Wide Bay and possibly even Queensland selection.

As a Bundaberg representative you have a responsibility to attend the following training sessions prior to Wide Bay Trials: (INCLUDE VENUE AND TIME INFORMATION)

You all have realistic chances of representing at a Wide Bay level and attending training sessions will be very important to improving your game to a standard that will warrant your selection in a Wide Bay team.

If you are not catching the bus YOU MUST still pay the full cost.

PLEASE NOTE: As transport costs are split evenly between the participants attending these trials, you have until three days prior to trials to indicate to your coach/ manager or school sport coordinator that you are NOT attending these trials. After this date you will incur the full transport cost, even if you do not attend these trials, unless your non-attendance is a result of illness, injury or other justifiable circumstances. School sport is unable to absorb the costs of transport for students that simply 'fail to show'.

DECIDE WELL IN ADVANCE IF YOU ARE NOT GOING TO PARTICIPATE AND ENSURE THIS IS INDICATED TO RELEVANT OFFICIALS.

School sport needs your assistance in this area to ensure transport to all trials remains financially viable and therefore access to representative sporting opportunities is a reality for ALL Bundaberg students.

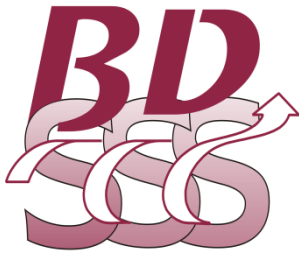

DISTRICT & WIDE BAY SELECTION TRIALS

STUDENTS MUST WEAR THEIR SCHOOL SPORTS UNIFORMS TO ALL DISTRICT TRIALS. DISTRICT OFFICIALS CAN REQUEST STUDENTS NOT TO TRIAL IF THEY ARE NOT WEARING APPROPRIATE ATTIRE

The following code of conduct highlights the level of expected behaviour of students, parents and spectators when participating in or attending Bundaberg District 13-19yrs School Sport (BDSSS) or affiliated events. Please ensure that you have read and understand this code and associated consequences prior to participating in or attending BDSSS events. **Please be aware that ignorance of the contents of this Code will not be accepted as an excuse for any breach.**

CODE OF BEHAVIOUR – STUDENT PARTICIPANTS

At Bundaberg District Trials or as a Bundaberg District team member:

- Take responsibility for your own behaviour and performance
- Compete by the competition conditions and rules.
- Never argue with the Judge's, Referee's or Umpire's decision.
- Control your temper – no criticism by word or gesture.
- Work equally hard for yourself and your team – your team's performance will benefit and so will your own.
- Be a good sport. Encourage and support your own team members.
- Show respect for yourself, your team mates, officials, your opponents and their skills.
- Behave in a manner that respects the rights of others
- Smoking, drinking of alcoholic beverages, use of any illegal substances and substance abuse is strictly forbidden.
- Entering or remaining upon restricted licensed premises, unless under the supervision of team officials, is strictly forbidden.
- Wear the official team uniform at all times, as directed by team management/officials.
- Stay in the designated team area and support other team members during times when you are not competing.
- Follow all directions of team management/officials.
- Ensure that you have telephone numbers of team managers with you at all times that you are not with the team.

CONSEQUENCES FOR BREACHES OF THIS CODE BY STUDENTS

Team managers may deal immediately with any breaches of this code by imposing appropriate consequences, including not playing remaining fixtures, notification of parents, and being sent home at your parents' cost. Bundaberg District School Sport (BDSSS) is responsible for imposing any longer term consequences to your future participation in BDSSS events.

Students may be notified orally or in writing of a temporary ban from participating or attending BDSSS fixtures until formal processes are conducted by BDSSS to determine complaints under this Code.

Students will be afforded natural justice in respect of breaches of this code and for any discipline under the EGPA. Furthermore, BDSSS may provide a report to your school about your conduct and, as a school representative, you may be subject to discipline in accordance with the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006* (EGPA).

- Provide a model of good sportsmanship for your child to copy.
- Be courteous and constructive in your communication with players, team officials, game officials and sport administrators.
- Encourage honest effort, skilled performance and team loyalty.
- Make any new parents feel welcome on all occasions.
- Do not interfere with the conduct of any events.
- Support School Sport Australia's policy of a smoke and alcohol free environment.

Spectators' Code of Conduct

- Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour at BDSSS / WBSS events.
- Remember children play for enjoyment; please don't let your behaviour detract from their enjoyment.
- Let game officials conduct events without interference.
- Support skilled performances and team play with generous applause.
- Demonstrate respect for opposing players and their supporters.
- Support our policy of a smoke and alcohol free environment

CONSEQUENCES FOR BREACHES OF THIS CODE BY PARENTS OR SPECTATORS

Team managers and event organisers may deal immediately with any breaches of this code by warning offenders about their conduct, asking offenders to leave venues, and calling police to intervene where necessary. Bundaberg District School Sport is responsible for imposing any longer term consequences such as written warnings, or barring attendance at future events for a period or indefinitely.

Parents and spectators may be notified orally or in writing of a temporary ban from attending BDSSS fixtures until formal processes are conducted by BDSSS to determine complaints under this Code. Parents and spectators will be afforded natural justice in respect of breaches of this code.

Parents and spectators should note that it is an offence to insult (meaning "to treat insolently or with contemptuous rudeness, to abuse") an officer of a state educational institution in the presence or hearing of students – s.333(2)(b) Wilful Disturbance, of the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006* (EGPA). Breaches of this section of the EGPA may result in a complaint being made to police.
